

Flick picks: Farmed Salmon Exposed

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While much critical attention has focused on Japanese fishing practices lately in films such as <u>The Cove</u> and At the Edge of the World (which screens at Vancity Theatre next week), a presentation by the Wild Salmon Circle will turn attention to Norway's domination of B.C. salmon farms and problems associated with the industry.

"Farmed Salmon Exposed", a 20-minute documentary by **Damien Gillis**, will be screened tonight (November 12) at 7 p.m. at the SFU Segal Centre (Room 1500, 500 Granville Street, tickets \$10). The film includes footage from Canada, Chile, Ireland, Scotland, and Norway. It also explores a possible link between the startling drop of this year's Fraser River sockeye and salmon farms. (This is something that was also <u>suggested</u> by fish biologist **Stan Proboszcz** in an interview with the *Straight*. As you can see by the comments left by readers, there's quite a debate about this topic.)

The screening be followed by a panel discussion with former Social Credit environment minister **Rafe Mair**, Chief **Robert Joseph** of the Broughton Archipelago Territory, UBC Fisheries Centre biologist **Pablo Trujillo**, and Gillis.

Afterwards, there'll be a chance for interested attendees to participate in a letter writing campaign.

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
