DATA IN INVERTEBRATES COLLECTED FROM SEAMOUNTS GLOBALLY

Data in invertebrates collected from seamounts globally. These data were used for the summary found in the chapter by Stocks on "Seamount invertebrates: composition and vulnerability to fishing" and were extracted from the database SeamountsOnline (<http://seamounts.sdsc.edu>). They are compiled from literature publications and electronic datasets provided by researchers and institutions working on seamounts – the last column indicates the source of each data record (full citation information for each can be found in the bibliography in Appendix 1c. When using the data, it is important to note the following:

- This table should be viewed as "presence only" data: the lack of a species from a given seamount does not necessarily indicate that the species is not found there. The seamount may simply not have been sampled appropriately to find that species.
- SeamountsOnline is the largest existing compilation of species data from seamounts, but it is a work in progress. Not all existing data are currently entered. Over time, the holdings will grow – we recommend readers go to <http://seamounts.sdsc.edu> to access the most current and complete data.
- Taxonomic names change over time, but it is beyond the scope of SeamountsOnline to track taxonomic revisions. For certain taxa we have replaced invalid, older names with the current valid names, but for most taxa the names are as given in the original data source.
- SeamountsOnline is assembled from a variety of original data sources – while it tries to target high-quality resources, it cannot guarantee the quality or correctness of its data holdings.
